Jazz Guitar University Introduction

Also, knowledge in basic chord construction would be great, so that tutorial will also be added to the prerequisite section as well. This type of study takes patience and persistence. Even if you don't have a strong desire to be a jazz guitar player, the more advanced theoretical and playing concepts found in jazz can be applied to almost all styles of music. It will just improve your overall musicianship immensely no matter what your style. Jazz music is an improvised art, and I think that is an area that ALL musicians would like to improve in.

One last thing, if you do have a desire to be a great jazz guitarist, one crucial element to this study is to actually listen to jazz music all the time. The more familiar you are with the sound of the various styles of jazz and it's greatest players, the quicker you will begin to sound like a well seasoned and educated jazz guitarist as well. Also, I think it would be great if you studied the history of jazz music in general. One great resource for this is Ken Burn's 10 DVD documentary series on jazz.
